2.5 Description of the facilities (spectator seating, locker rooms, warm-up areas, etc.)

Each court (with wooden floors and an electronic scoreboard) has locker rooms for the home and away team, that is, the venue has locker rooms to accommodate the teams that are playing, as well as the referee team. The venue has a warm-up area (outdoor courts). It has just 10 seats for the public of each team, so additional stands will be installed. Restaurant available.

2.6 Describe the venue with respect to the Red Book requirements. If the venue does not meet the Red Book requirements, what are your plans for dealing with this?

The venue will meet the Red Book requirements.

2.7 What events are usually held in this venue?

The Valencia Basket Club S.A.D. trains and plays its games here, along with a variety of basketball tournaments organized by different entities and other professional teams that train here seeking the excellence of this facility.

2.8 Why did you choose this venue?

The large number of indoor courts with electronic devices makes it a unique venue in Europe. Close to the Village.

2.9 If more than one venue will be used, what are the issues and solutions for this (transportation, communication, etc.)?

Only one venue will be used.

3.1 Anticipated number of participants

538 (338)

3.2 Expected breakdown (by gender, by region of origin). On what basis were these numbers derived?

55 teams: 30 men's and 25 women's. We have based these numbers off of participation in the last Gay Games and the basketball tradition in our country.

4.5* Will a local club be involved in the organization of the event?

The local clubs of the FBCV and the GMadrid LGBTQ+ Club.

4.6 What local experience is available to the host in organizing competitions for this sport?

The FBCV organizes several basketball tournaments with a greater number of participants during each season, as well as all official competitions in the region.

5.0 Organization of the Event

5.1 Description of tournament (seeding, rounds, etc.), relative to Red Book requirements.

We will follow the Red Book requirements.

There will be a separate General and Women's Basketball Tournament. The basketball tournament will consist of two sessions: Preliminary Rounds (pool play) and Double.

Elimination rounds.

We believe it is necessary to restrict the number of participants to achieve excellence in the tournament.

5.2 Categories/Divisions

We are considering offering the following categories: Master General (5 teams), Open General and Women (championship and recreational) with 10 teams each. We would also offer the possibility of tournament registrations for people with disabilities in wheelchairs (5 teams) and for people with intellectual diversity (5 teams). We suggest creating a waiting list for each proposed category to be able to expand a category if there is another that does not come through. The largest competition we can organize in this venue is with 55 teams. For this reason, we are thinking of restricting the Veterans category, as it requires playing half-court games and it would be more complex to organize than what can be handled. If we decide to offer this category, we would have to consider adding another venue.

5.3 Scheduling (number of days, etc.)

6 days

5.4 Number of competitive instances per athlete

If the category has 5 teams registered: minimum of 4 games and maximum of 6; with a registration of 10 teams: minimum of 10 games and maximum of 11.

5.5 Total number of competitive instances

250 games for a simulated, maximum participation of 55 teams.

5.6 If the event is ticketed, how will tickets be sold, distributed, and collected?

This event is not slated to be ticketed.

5.7 Is sport-specific sponsorship possible for this event?

It is possible. We will be exploring various options as we move towards hosting the event.

6.0 Specific FGG Policies

6.1 How will you address requirements of Policy guidelines for Age and Ability?

We can accommodate up to 10 more teams, reaching a total of 55. In compliance with the Red Book, we will offer the Championship and Recreational divisions. Detailed information in point 5.2.

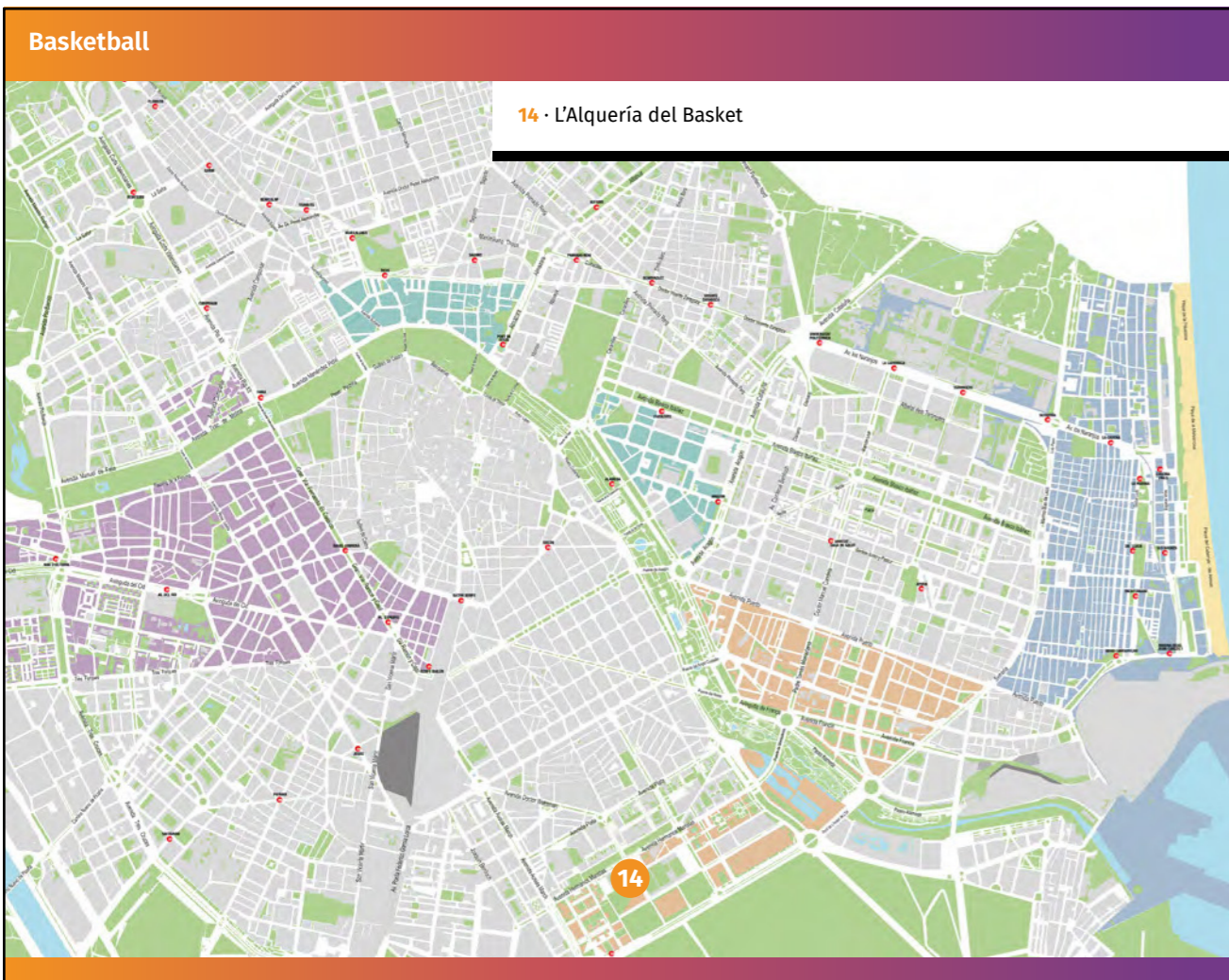
6.2 How will you address requirements of Policy guidelines for Disability?

A wheelchair division should be offered if possible. The venue is perfectly accessible, both for the athletes who play and for the public in a wheelchair.

6.3 How will you address requirements of Policy guidelines for Gender in Sport?

Standard policy applies. Mixed-gender teams can compete in the general division. A general category and another women-only category will be offered.

6.4 How will you address requirements of Policy guidelines for Health and Well-being, and in particular, Performance-Enhancing Drugs?



There will be a mobile health team that will move around the area for any emergencies. Athletes will be observed to ensure they comply with anti-doping regulations and have exemplary behavior.

6.5 How will you address requirements of Policy guidelines for Officials?

The table officials and referees will be procured by the FBCV, complying with the requirements of the Red Book. 1 referee per game and three table officials will be appointed. Each referee team will work for three consecutive games, complying with the Red Book regulations.

6.6 Will you be able to meet sport- specific Red Book requirements? What are the difficulties you foresee for meeting these requirements, and how will you deal with them? What gives you confidence that you will be able to respect Red Book requirements?

We do not foresee any difficulties in complying with the requirements of the Red Book, as long as registration in the categories that we have specified is controlled. We have extensive experience in organizing this type of event in our sport.
